# 3. Council Funded Project Options

- o Seeds of Hope Community Art Project was presented: Goal:We would partner with HEAL Winchendon, the Town of Winchendon, & the Schools, to amplify youth and resident voices and visions for what they love about our community and what they hope for the future to make it better in a way that will bring our community together and increase pride, inclusion, unity and engagement. Students and residents will create artwork that speaks to: All student submissions will be displayed in an art show at GALA in town on June 12 in coordination with the Taste of Winchendon celebration hosted by HEAL Winchendon. Selected pieces will be put on street banners throughout Winchendon. In the fall, we hope to incorporate students' art into one or various community murals either permanent or on mobile canvas.
  - i. Jill moved to approve to set aside \$1000 for the production of spring banners based on the proposal that Miranda and Linsey presented and will share with all members with the council. Andrew seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.
- o **Spring of 2022 Day of Art & Culture:** There is a lack of knowledge about and cohesion around all the wonderful things happening in town, how can we make people aware? This fair would highlight all of the things happening. Free to the public. Costs could include a program, publicity, funds for programming, music, etc.
