## Ingleside Utilization Committee Meeting at Ingleside Property November 13, 2017

## Winchendon School Service Learning & Ingleside

The School has two related groups: Trail and Water (Millers River Watershed/River Rat Program)

The Trail group is focused on 3 major trails: 1) Elm Street, 2) around the field, 3) opposite Woodlawn Ave through old growth forest. They are producing a survey of each trail, looking at specific areas of need to make each a good path: 1) identify issues, i.e. drainage issues and 2) identify how to resolve these issues

The students are also thinking about trail usage – beyond the rehabilitation of the trails: i.e. an environmental education club to get kids more involved with trails, hiking

The School/students were receptive/aligned with comments from the IUC: the mission to build community and recruit other resources; involve Murdock students and community volunteers; to be inclusive – across ages; have trails that incorporate picnic, exercise/fitness, bird and nature observation with a portion that are ADA compliant; build stewardship for Ingleside/the environment. Involvement with Ingleside is a long-term commitment for the Service Learning students. It is viewed as a learning experience/opportunity. (Note: Mr. Harvey commented that learning about grant writing should be part of this)

Some initial areas for coordination/communication between the IUC and School

- Meet to review their trail survey.
- Develop ways to coordinate communication and activities and to reach into the broader town community. Facebook will be a major vehicle. The School has lots they could post, especially during the winter when they can't be working on trails.
- The School will produce a map of the trails. Something to include in the Robinson Broadhurst proposal (due at the Town Manager's office on 12/13 or 14). Consider how to involve the students in the grant drafting/review process (?)

Questions/offers from Mr. Harvey who lived at Ingleside for 15 years: 1) will motorized vehicles be prohibited at Ingleside (IUC needs to follow-up with policy/posting); 2) consider the name Ingleside Forest; 3) he knows a lot about the buildings as well as the land and is available as a resource. Reminder that clearing trails for winter use has to factor in snow height when trimming tree branches

- 1. Ken and Fran will meet with Al Gallant to discuss details re the new exit and to gather available cost information: benches, picnic tables etc.
- 2. Jane will draft proposal with placeholders for details on materials, costs
- 3. ? follow up with Winchendon School on map, etc.
- 4. Greg will invite Sarah Wells of Mount Grace Land Conservation Trust to our next meeting and ask her to share her experience/advice on trails/activities related to the R-B proposal. (Sarah, MRPC, MA DCR may be able to identify other grant sources for environmental education programs – that would make use of the trails; something important for the R-B grant application)
