Minutes from December COA meeting were moved and accepted.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT: A grant has been requested for food pantry items. Montachusett Home Care and Heywood Hospital have been good supporters. Local churches have made many helpful donations to the Senior Center. Monetary donations have helped a lot. Some products needed include toilet paper, tuna and/or chicken salads with crackers, spaghetti sauce, cereal, or cookies, etc. The food pantry is busier than usual and is well used.
